16-18 Vulnerable Bursary

	A bursary of £1,200 is available for students studying a course lasting 30 weeks or more, meet							
	the criteria stated below and have a financial need.							
Eligibility	• Aged 16-18							
	 Enrolled on a full-time funded course lasting 30 weeks or more. 							
	 Are classed as Child Looked After/Living In Care or Care Leaver or 							
	Receiving Income Support, or Universal Credit in your own right, because you are							
	financially supporting yourself <u>or</u>							
	Financially supporting yourself and someone who is dependent on you and living with							
	you such as a child or partner <u>or</u>							
	 Are in receipt of DLA or PIP in your own right as well as Employment Support Allowance 							
	or Universal Credit in your own right.							
	Satisfy UK residency criteria.

16-18 Free College Meals

	If you received a free school meal in Year 11, you should tick the box on your on-line enrolment form. This will then continue within college.
Eligibility	To be eligible for Free School Meals, you or your parent/s must be in receipt of one or more of the means tested benefits as outlined on the government website. https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals . (If you do not qualify for free college meals, you may still be entitled to college meals from the 16-18 bursary fund). This will be assessed as part of the Bursary Fund application.
How much	Your student ID card will be pre-loaded with credit for each timetabled day that you attend
you receive	college to enable you to purchase food and drink from the College Refectories, Eating Places, Coffee Shops or Bistro
Not eligible	Students over 19, unless you have an EHCP or are a 19+ returner.

Eligibility	 You must have your advanced learner loan approved before bursary can allocate additional funding. (https://www.gov.uk/advanced-learner-loan to apply) Aged 19 and over Enrolled on a level 3 or level 4 full or part time funded course. Able to evidence the need for financial assistance and are in receipt of, or dependent upon an eligible means tested benefit or classed as receiving low income. Satisfy UK residency criteria. Have a bank account in your own name in order to receive payments.

Course equipment,	Help towards the purchase of course equipment and uniforms which are considered

Lunch	Your student ID card will be pre-loaded with lunch credit for each timetabled day that			
	you attend college to enable you to purchase food and drink from the College			
	Refectories, Eating Places, Coffee Shops or Bistro. (Excludes PT eve students)			
Free College Meals (16-19 Bursary Fund students only)	Allocated to students who have been granted free meals from the local authority and were eligible for free school meals during Year 11. You must tick the box on the enrolment form if you have previously received Free School Meals. Your student ID			
	card will then be pre-loaded as above if you qualify.			
Childcare (19+ Discretionary Fund and Advanced Learner Loan students only)	You must be aged 20 years and over. Childcare funding is only paid for the days and hours that you attend your college course or placement. Students aged under 20 can claim childcare funding online through the Care to Learn scheme. www.gov.uk/care-to-learn			
Tuition fees for 19+: (19+ Discretionary Fund students only)	Depending on your circumstances, tuition fees for some courses may be free. If you are required to pay fees and you are eligible, we may be able to help towards these course fees. Depending on your prior qualification, if you are studying a level 3 programme you may need to apply for a advanced learner loan for help with fees.			
Work/Industry	(16-18 only) If your placement is more than 2 miles from your home address you may			
Placement/Expenses (16-19 Bursary Fund students only)	be eligible for help with travel expenses. You may also be entitled to other expenses incurred during your placement such as lunch or uniform if required.			
Trips, residential visits	Payment towards the cost of <u>essential</u> trips and visits required as part of your course.			
and University	Help with a contribution towards the cost of travelling to universities for interviews.			
interviews	(You will be required to provide an interview letter and receipts for any travel).			
UCAS Fees	Help towards to cost of your UCAS application registration fees.			

Note: Eligible Asylum Seekers may only receive support in the form of meal credit or bus passes. No cash payments can be made. The funds cannot be used to support general living costs.

How do I apply?

You can apply for a bursary by either computer or mobile phone and you **must** be an enrolled learner at the college. Students joining for September 2023, can apply for bursary funding once enrolled in August. Continuing and progressing learners need to re-apply each academic year for financial assistance – there is no automatic carry forward of any award given.

Applying for financial support is made through the PayMyStudent Portal. This online process enables you to fill out an application form and submit the necessary evidence that will be used to determine your eligibility.

It is recommended that you follow the 'How Do I Apply Guide' when completing your bursary application. A copy of this guide can be obtained during enrolment, from all college receptions, downloaded from the college website - (College life/financial help/bursaries) or by clicking on the link on the Pay My Student portal.

You will now need to follow all instructions as set out in the 'How Do I Apply Guide' to complete your bursary application.
